SHOULD YOU APPLY?

Check whether you are eligible and ready to apply by completing this checklist **before** starting an application.

1. DO YOU MEET THE ELIGIBILITY AND PRIORITIZATION CRITERIA?

- Your organization has a Federal 501(c)(3) tax-exempt status
- Your organization is in good standing with SDAT
- You have a CVRS number
- If you plan to apply for the core Community Projects Fund Grant Program and NOT the Fentanyl Use, Overdoses, and Death Reduction Grant Program, your organization meets the definition of a Small and Emerging or Volunteer-Led (i.e. has an annual budget of less than \$250,000 and employs less than three full-time positions)
- If your organization is currently implementing a Montgomery County contract or grant, you are current on all reporting obligations

2. DO YOUR PROPOSED ACTIVITIES FIT WITHIN THE SCOPE OF ACTIVITIES TO BE FUNDED AS DESCRIBED IN THE NOFO?

- All activities and expenditures under your grant are in Montgomery County OR are exclusively for Montgomery County residents
- Proposed expenses are for a new activity, expansion of existing activities or a combination of both.
- You plan on submitting only one application in this cycle (unless you are applying to the FY24 Fentanyl Use, Overdose, and Death Reduction Grant Program, in which case, you may submit more than 1 application)
- If planning to apply for FY24 Fentanyl Use, Overdose, and Death Reduction Grant Program, your activities target the following zip codes: 20910, 20860, 20912, 20877, 20842
- If planning to apply for FY24 Fentanyl Use, Overdose, and Death Reduction Grant Program, your budget prioritizes activity-focused expenditures, does not include direct transfer of funds to participants or capital expenses
